

# VILLAGE OF LUDLOW VERMONT

## COIN DROP ORDINANCE

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### ARTICLE 1. AUTHORITY

- 1.01 Pursuant to the authority of 23 V.S.A. § 1008, the Village of Ludlow hereby adopts the following Ordinance for management and regulation of Coin Drops.

### ARTICLE 2. APPROVAL

- 2.01 All coin drops requests must be approved by the Chief of Police and then submitted to the Village Trustees for final approval.

### ARTICLE 3. LIMITATIONS

- 3.01 The Village Trustees will approve not more than four (4) coin drops for each year and not more than one in any 30 day period.

### ARTICLE 4. CONSIDERATION

- 4.01 Consideration will be given to organizations that have broad community constituency and have a prior record of properly organized events.

### ARTICLE 5. REGULATIONS

- 5.01 Each request will be accompanied by a plan that details the day, the proposed location and duration (between the hours of 10:00 AM and 2:00 PM) of the proposed coin drop.
- 5.02 Each request will include an insurance certificate indemnifying the Village of Ludlow (\$500,000.00 minimum).

ARTICLE 6. APPROPRIATE ATTIRE

- 6.01 Organizations that receive approval will provide appropriate attire for staff and professionally lettered signage identifying the charity.

ARTICLE 7. EQUIPMENT

- 7.01 Organizations that receive approval will provide the necessary equipment for proper traffic control in the drop area.

ARTICLE 8. SEVERABILITY

- 8.01 If any section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance, or any part thereof, is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid or ineffective by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity or effectiveness of the remaining portions of this Ordinance or any part thereof.
- 8.02 The Board of Trustees hereby declares that it would have passed each section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase thereof irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, subdivisions, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, or phrases be declared unconstitutional or ineffective.

ARTICLE 9. PUBLICATION AND EFFECTIVE DATE

The foregoing ordinance is hereby adopted by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Ludlow, Vermont, this second day of September, 2003.

ARTICLE 9 above is amended to read:

- 9.01 No section of this Ordinance shall be construed to supersede or replace any Vermont statute.
- 9.02 This Ordinance shall be entered in the minutes of the Board of Trustees meeting, and posted in at least five (5) conspicuous places with the Village of Ludlow and published in a newspaper circulating in the Village on a day not more than fourteen (14) days following the date when the Ordinance is adopted.
- 9.03 This ordinance shall become effective on June 2, 2008, sixty (60) days after the date of its adoption by the Village Board Trustees, unless a petition is filed with the Village Clerk by May 15, 2008, forty-four (44) days after the date of its adoption. The petition should be addressed to the Village Trustees, should be signed by at least five percent (5%) of

the qualified voters of this municipality, and should ask for a special meeting to be called on the question of disapproving the ordinance.
